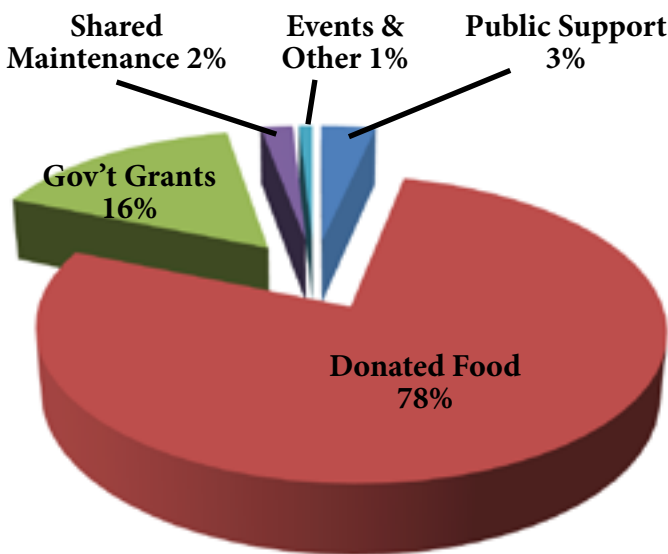

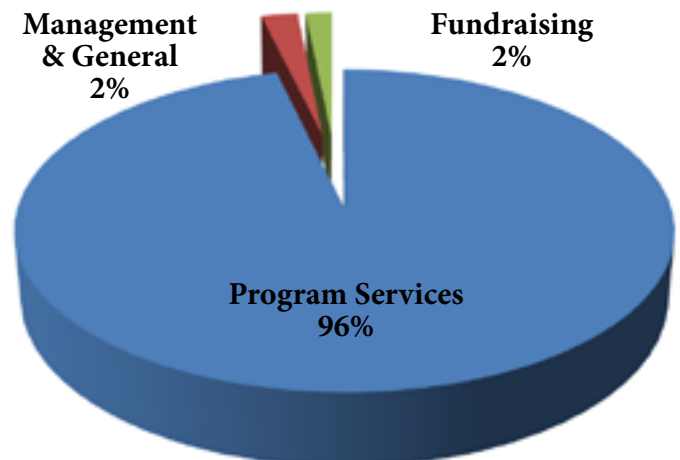

Based on FY14 achievements, the Food Bank RGV attained a 4 Star rating from Charity Navigator.

Chris Bueno was hired to manage our Community Garden Project, which will enable us to teach 25 families how to grow their own food organically and help them with healthy food options and self-sustainability, and has expanded the popularity and growth of the Pharrmers Market (open 4pm to 7pm every Thursday except summer).

We received a new retail truck from the Walmart Foundation that will give us reliable and efficient transport of much needed foods. It has been a great addition as our fleet is aging.
